

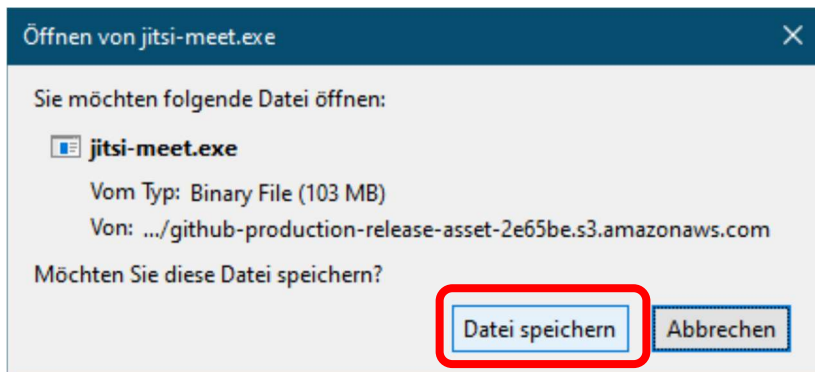
Jitsi-installation (without administrator rights)

The Jitsi Client can be downloaded from the following URL:

Clicking the URL already triggers the download.



Save the file when you are prompted to do so, as in this example with Firefox.

After successfully downloading the jitsi-meet.exe, you must start it. You will find the file either in your download folder or in your browser under the download icon in the upper right corner.



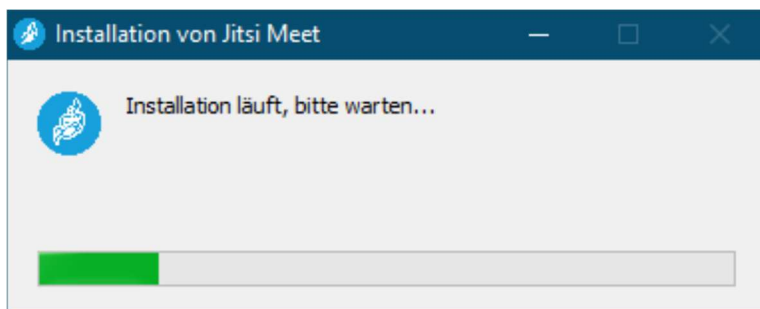
Start jitsi-meet.exe from Firefox with a single click, or from the Windows download folder with a double click.



When you open the file, a warning message from Windows appears. Click on "further information" to get to the "Run anyway" button.



Then the installation will start immediately.

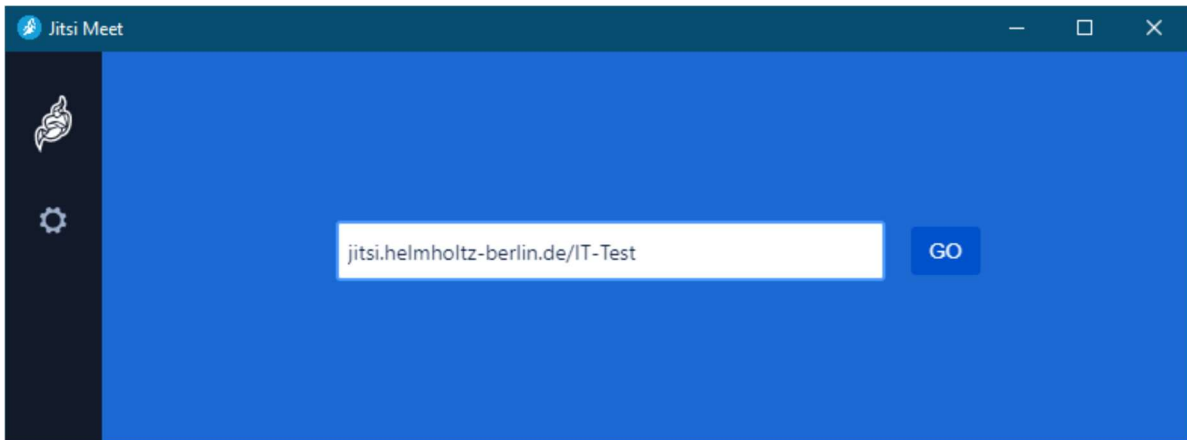


If a Windows Firewall message appears, it can be rejected. The Jitsi-Client is functional even without these rights.

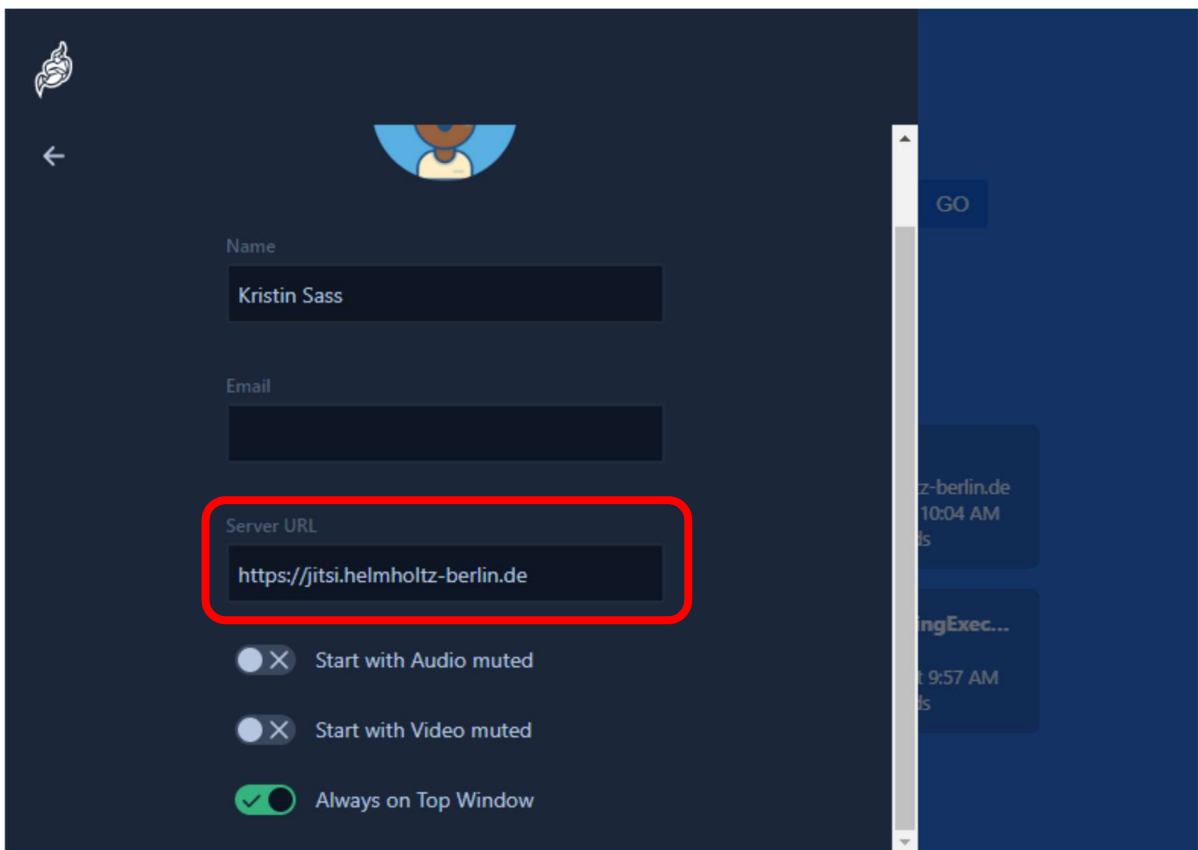
After successful installation, you will find a shortcut to Jitsi Meet on your desktop and the application will also start directly.

There is also a Jitsi app for smartphones that can be used. Both for devices running the Android operating system and for iOS on iPhones and iPads.

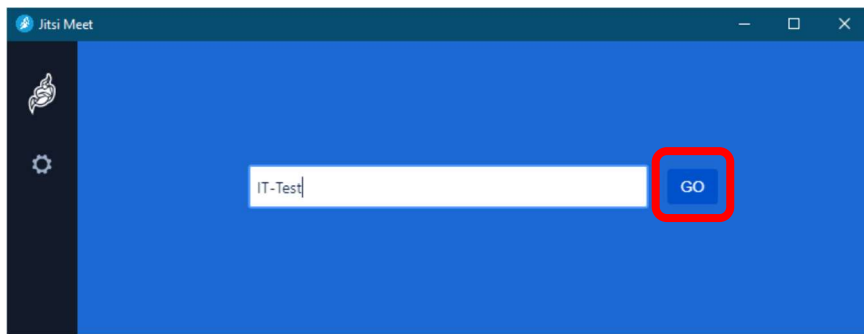
When using the Jitsi-Client, you can specify the complete link to the meeting room in the main window.



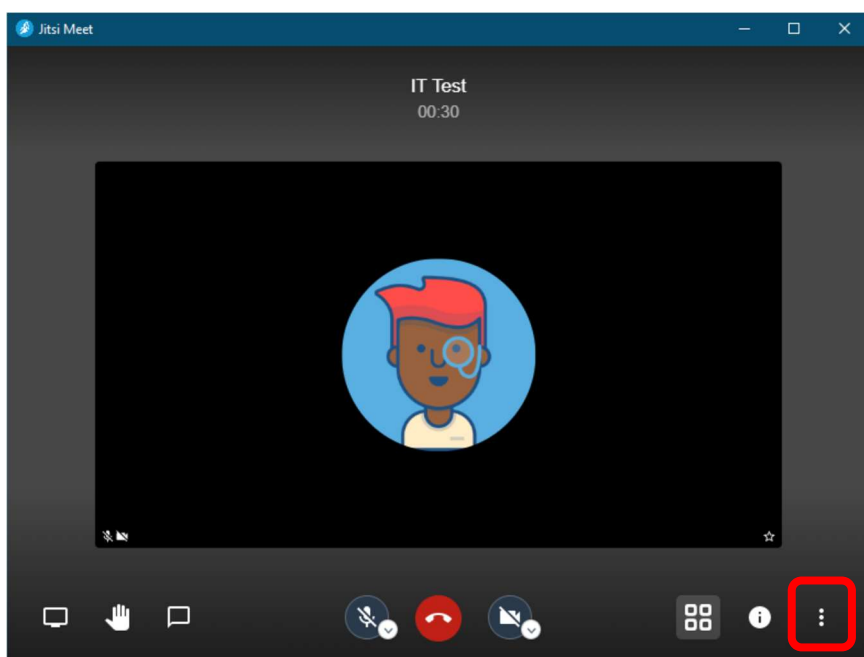
But you can also define the jitsi server under settings (gear-icon, top left), so that you only have to enter the room name in the previous window.



Confirm the input by clicking again in the light blue area (right).



By clicking on "GO" you start the meeting / enter the created room.



You can adjust the camera and microphone settings while the connection is running on the three dots at the bottom right and then there under "Settings" if there are problems with sound and image.
